Charlotte is the "Queen City" named for the wife of King George III, the reigning English monarch during its incorporation in 1768. It was settled by Scots-Irish descendants and has evolved into a mosaic of cultures, faiths and races.

Charlotte was named "Most Livable Community for the Visually Impaired" by the American Foundation for the Blind," one of the "Top 10 Cities for African-Americans to Live, Work and Play" by *Black Enterprise* and the *Ladies Home Journal* chose Charlotte as one of the top 20 cities for women.
