Though this book is designed primarily for the professional architectural stained glass studio, there is also a section on safety in the home studio. This book deals with safety-mindedness, employee education and OSHA; safety basics, lead intoxication, symptoms and treatments; lead exposure and protection; safety on the jobsite; sandblasting safety; the dangers of acid, and environmental protection — including TRI reporting.
