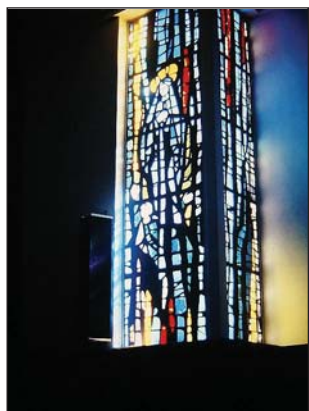


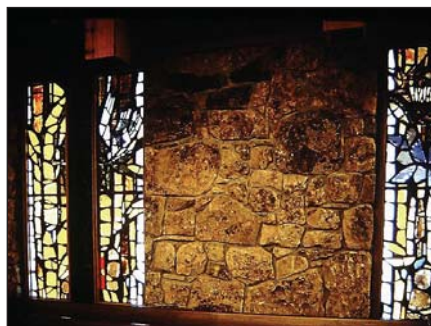

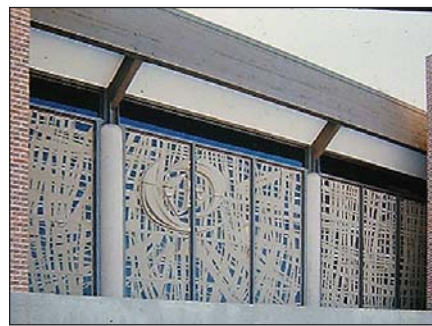

The installations presented on these pages are by internationally known artist Jean-Jacques Duval of Saranac, New York.

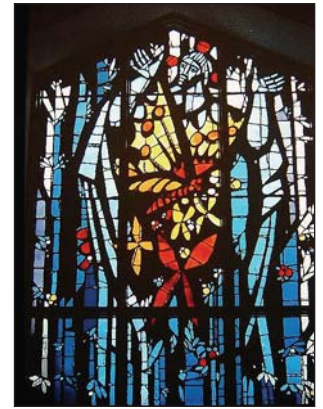

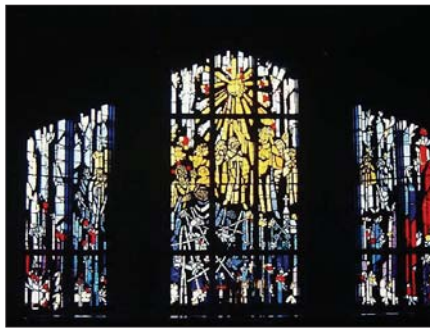
